To pigeonhole the work of Clay Bartlett, 40, and a graduate of the Armour Institute of Technology, as impressionistic, expressionistic, social conscious, art-of-tomorrow, bourgeois, or American scene, etc., is hardly to my liking, nor I should think to Mr. Bartlett's either. It is the picture itself which is important, not the category in which it is placed.

In the beginning of Mr. Bartlett's career as an artist he came under the influence of the modern French painters, and while the gaiety, the lightness, of the French touch still lingers, he has through the years evolved his own personal idiom. His development has been slow but it has been sure until today his work reflects a refreshing personal approach. He has travelled much and paints easily, delightfully and decoratively scenes from his experiences, and he particularly loves to depict the countryside and people of Vermont where he makes his home.
