IN presenting this small group of paintings by Albert P. Ryder it is useless to dwell here on his stature as an artist, or even to remark his unique mysticism, his romantic flights into that realm of nature which is hidden from the visual eye and which responds only to those who are emotionally sensitive to its whisperings.

All the significant facets of his temperament have long since been explored and given to us in scholarly and sympathetic studies, so that now it would be plainly bromidic to say that Ryder is a great artist. This we have long known; and so it is not for the purpose of "introducing" him that this small selection has been arranged. Rather, it is that since his life's work is so very limited, withal his three-score years and ten, it seems ever timely and ever a privilege to linger with his art — his "painted poetry", as often as this is possible. True genius is never wearisome.
