EMIL CARLSEN, N. A.

Mr. Carlsen was born in Copenhagen, Denmark, and came to this country in 1872. He won the Shaw Prize at the Society of American Artists in 1904, and a Gold Medal at the St. Louis Exposition the same year. In 1905, he took the Webb Landscape Prize of the same Society, and two years later, the Inness Gold Medal at the National Academy of Design. He won a Bronze Medal at the Carnegie Institute in 1908, and the same honor at the International Fine Arts Exposition in Buenos Aires in 1910. He is the winner of the Temple Gold Medal in the present exhibition of the Pennsylvania Academy of Fine Arts in Philadelphia.

His work is represented in the Metropolitan Museum; the Brooklyn Institute of Arts and Sciences; the Corcoran Gallery, Washington, D. C.; the Albright Art Gallery, Buffalo; the Art Institute of Chicago; the Rhode Island School of Design, Providence; and the Golden Gate Park Museum, San Francisco. He is a member of the National Academy of Design and of the National Institute of Arts and Letters.
