

FOREWORD

A BOUT fifteen years ago Hayley Lever first came to America, bringing with him a wealth of material from St. Ives on the Cornish Coast, where he had lived since leaving his native Australia. Most of the canvases he then brought with him are now scattered about this country in prominent museums and private collections. Many of the pictures he has since painted have reached similar destinations.

Until this fall it was not known that he had left behind him in England fifteen or twenty of that same St. Ives series that won him such prompt recognition here. There they have remained, however, and it is largely due to one of his good friends who discovered them and insisted that they be brought to this country, that we are able to show them together now.
