## FOREWORD

THOSE who think the method of the Impressionists the only way to paint do not like Sartain. Those to whom the tonalists are gospel have long wondered why he has not been ranked with the other great men of that school. The considerable number who have no hard and fast rules about schools and isms, are perhaps better qualified to rank himthan either of the other two groups.

To them he must appear for just what he was—a tremendously sound craftsman, thoroughly schooled in drawing and the technique of painting. He was entirely within his rights in adhering to the traditions of painting that he most respected. They were the traditions that Martin and Hunt, particularly, and Inness and Wyant, to lesser degree, likewise followed, and there are those among us who find no necessity of discarding them while appreciating things more modern in tendency.

It would be futile at this time to claim for Sartain a definite place among our painters. That place, in days to come, will be given him by others. It is entirely proper now to claim for him the distinction of painting a landscape that is wholly delightful and satisfying to live with; an interior that is almost alone in American work; a head of a quality and beauty that will hang without apology with the best art of its kind.

At the prices authorized by his Executor, Sartain's work should become a part of many homes where he is not now represented.
