#### FOREWORD

For many years Gloucester has been the center of one of the largest and most important of our summer art colonies. Along the coast from Boston to Portland, some of the great figures, living and dead, in American art, have had their studios, and have sent to metropolitan exhibitions canvases that have made the region famous wherever native art is known.

In 1922 the North Shore Art Association was formally incorporated "to advance American Art by education, through exhibitions, and in all other ways possible". Over 250 artists who spend their summers in the vicinity are members, and most of them contribute to the annual exhibitions at the North Shore Galleries—a Gloucester sail-loft admirably adapted to the purpose.

The exhibition there this past summer was of unusual excellence. Our selections from it, necessarily limited in the number and size of paintings, gives but a meagre impression of the collection as a whole. It does reflect, however, some of the spirit of the exhibition, and it brings before our visitors the work of a number of artists whom we do not often have the privilege of showing.

Gloucester should certainly be on the itinerary of art lovers who travel "down east" and who like to see and know the artist in his summer work-shop.
