Abstract Theodore Rousseau (1912-1973) served in the U.S. Navy during World

War II and in the Art Looting Investigation Unit of the Office of Strategic Services before being appointed Associate Curator of Paintings at The Metropolitan Museum of Art in 1947. He was named Curator in 1948 and Chairman of the Department of European Paintings in 1967, and was elected Vice Director of the Museum and appointed its Curator-in-Chief in 1968. The records contain predominantly documents created during his tenure at The Metropolitan Museum of Art as both departmental curator and in his role as Museum Vice Director. These include correspondence related to curatorial departments, acquisitions, and deaccessioning, as well as clippings, articles, and photographs of works of art. They also include documents from his long professional involvement with the International Council of Museums, drafts and final versions of his professional writings and lecture presentations, his planners and calendars, travel-related information, research publications, and images including postcards of

European, Caribbean, and American buildings, works of art, and people.

Biographical note

Theodore Rousseau (1912-1973) served in the U.S. Navy during World War II and in the Art Looting Investigation Unit of the Office of Strategic Services before being appointed Associate Curator of Paintings at The Metropolitan Museum of Art in 1947. He was named Curator in 1948 and Chairman of the Department of European Paintings in 1967, and was elected Vice Director of the Museum and appointed its Curator-in-Chief in 1968.

Educated at Eton, the Sorbonne, and Harvard University, Rousseau traveled in Europe before World War II to research medieval French art, and served at the National Gallery of Art in Washington, D.C. from 1940 to 1941 as assistant curator of paintings. After his wartime naval service, his duties with the Art Looting Investigation Unit of the Office of Strategic Services included arresting and questioning Germans suspected of art thefts from occupied nations. His findings were used in the recovery of works of art and as evidence in the Nuremberg trials.

Under Rousseau's curatorship the Department of European Paintings made notable acquisitions including Georges de la Tour's *Fortune Teller* in 1960, Rembrandt's *Aristotle contemplating the bust of Homer* in 1961, and Monet's *Terrace at Sainte Addresse* in 1967, as well as Velazquez's *Juan de Pareja*, which was purchased at auction in 1970 for five and a half million dollars. During his tenure the Museum undertook a controversial deaccessioning of paintings and other objects in its collections that was widely publicized and discussed. Rousseau participated in meetings of the International Council on Museums beginning in 1948, and chaired ICOM's Committee on Scientific Laboratories in Museums and Sub-Committee on the Conservation of Paintings. He was named a Chevalier of the Legion d'Honneur and admitted to the U.S. Legion of Merit in 1946; in 1962 he received the Order of Orange-Nassau from the Netherlands and the Order of Alfonso X el Sabio from Spain.

He died on December 31, 1973, one day before his retirement, when his election as the first Museum curator to become a Museum Trustee would have gone into effect.

Scope and Contents note

The Theodore Rousseau records contain predominantly documents created during his tenure at The Metropolitan Museum of Art as both departmental curator and in his role as Museum Vice Director. These include correspondence related to curatorial departments, acquisitions, and deaccessioning, as well as clippings, articles, and photographs of works of art. They also include documents from his long professional involvement with the

International Council of Museums, drafts and final versions of his professional writings and lecture presentations, his planners and calendars, travel-related information, research publications, and images including postcards of European, Caribbean, and American buildings, works of art, and people. The records also include material predating his Museum employment, including his undergraduate thesis, documents from his military service, as well information on his death on December 31, 1973, and his funeral and memorial service.

Historical note

The late 1960s was a period of administrative change at the Metropolitan Museum. On December 20, 1966, Thomas P.F. Hoving was named Director, succeeding James Rorimer, who had died suddenly in May. Joseph V. Noble was elected to the newly created post of Vice Director for Administration, after having served as Operating Administrator and then chairman of the Administrative Committee that directed the Museum after Rorimer's death. Curators' Meetings were first organized in June 1966 at the request of the Administrative Committee, and the Director attended some early meetings. These meetings were later renamed the Curators' Council.

Series III. International Council of Museums 1954, 1961-1972 (bulk 1961-1969)

Historical note

Founded in 1946, the International Council of Museums (ICOM) is an international nongovernmental organization of museums and museum professionals committed to the conservation, continuation, and communication to society of the world's natural and cultural heritage.

Its first General Conference was held in 1948 in Paris and the second in London in 1950. Subsequent conferences were scheduled triennially in European capital cities. In 1954 the Metropolitan Museum hosted an ICOM-sponsored International Congress on Art History and Museology, at which invited guests from museums and cultural institutions worldwide presented papers. ICOM's 7th General Conference in 1965 - the first to be held outside of Europe - was hosted by the Metropolitan Museum and chaired by Director James J. Rorimer. Before the conference in New York, delegates participated in site visits at museums in Washington, D.C. including celebrations for the bicentennial of the birth of James Smithson, and in Philadelphia.

Rousseau was active on ICOM's Committee for Scientific Museum Laboratories and chaired the Sub-Committee for the Care of Paintings. Joint committee and sub-committee meetings were held concomitant with General Conferences as well as separately in intervening years: in Barcelona in 1961, Leningrad in 1963, Brussels in 1967, and Amsterdam in 1969.

Scope and Contents note

The subseries includes planning materials, draft and final reports, correspondence, and information on host cities and local cultural organizations. ICOM is a bilingual organization: many reports are in English and French, as is some of Rousseau's correspondence.

Arrangement note

The series is organized chronologically by ICOM conference or event, followed by folders of general correspondence and reports.

Series V. Personal 1939-1974

Historical note

Rousseau's duties with the Art Looting Investigation Unit of the Office of Strategic Services after World War II included arresting and questioning Germans suspected of art thefts from occupied nations. His findings were used in the recovery of works of art and as evidence in the Nuremberg trials. Among those he interrogated was Bruno Lohse, who had been appointed by Hermann Göring to Hitler's special art looting unit, the Einsatzstab Reichsleiter Rosenberg. For his cooperation with French and American forces, including testimony regarding the ERR's activities, Lohse was acquitted of war crimes in a 1950 military tribunal.

In March 1961, Rousseau was robbed and beaten in the lobby of his Manhattan apartment building by a man later apprehended and determined to have been addicted to heroin.

Rousseau's health began to deteriorate in early 1973, and that summer he was hospitalized for unidentified surgery that left him significantly weakened. He died on December 31, 1973, one day before his retirement, when his election as the first Museum curator to become a Museum Trustee would have gone into effect.

Scope and Contents note

The series includes records pertaining to Rousseau's military service, correspondence including drafts of outgoing letters to his father in French, travel information, and the contents of a travel portfolio including hotel stationery from London and Paris, wartime identification cards, tickets, and photographs. It also includes clippings documenting Rousseau's mugging, and records pertaining to his death and memorial services.
